English

In the story, he meets a Martian. They both have their own homes on their different planets. I wonder, if you designed a planet – what would it look like? What would it be called? Who would live on the planet? What material would the planet be made of? What is the weather like?



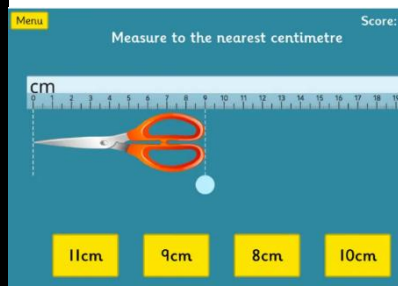
You could draw your planet, write a story about someone landing on your planet, you could even make your planet! I would love to see your amazing creations!
