- 1.The first Romans lived in Italy nearly 3000 years ago.
- 2.They founded the city of Rome in 753 BC and, over the centuries, **conquered** many lands to create a huge **empire**.
- 3.The Celts were people living in **tribes** in Britain at the time of ancient Rome, including the Iceni, Brigantes and Catuvellauni.
- 4.In 55 and 54 BC, Julius Caesar made attempts to **invade** Britain, but his **legions** weren't able to overcome the Celts.
5. In AD43, Emperor Claudius launched a third attack on Britain. This time, much of **Britannia** did become another **province** of Rome.
- 6.The Ancient Egypt time period started over 2000 years before Ancient Rome, but continued into the Ancient Rome period. In fact, Egypt was conquered by Rome in 30BC.
