Math:

Our units this term are division and fractions including:

Ordering and comparing fractions, adding and subtracting fractions and also work on area and perimeter.

A detailed breakdown of the learning objectives we will cover this half term can be found here.

Science:

Living things and their habitats:

Pupils will be taught to:

- describe the differences in the life cycles of a mammal, an amphibian, an insect and a bird.
- describe the life process of reproduction in some plants and animals.

Geography:

- Describe route, direction and location, linking 8 points of compass to degrees on compass.
- Plan a journey to a place in another part of the world, taking account of distance and time.
- Name and locate many of the world's major rivers on maps.
- Name and locate many of the world's most famous mountain regions on maps.
- Locate the USA and Canada on a world map and atlas.

We will be looking at the lives of different explorers who changed how we look at the world. We will also look at how their mindset impacted upon their expeditions. Explorers will include: including Edmund Hillary/ Ibn Battuta/ Robert Falcon Scott and Amelia Earheart. Our geography topic will be concentrating on rivers and mountains of the world.



KIRFS- Key Instant Recall Facts and Skills- For children to learn in school and at home!

- The 4 points of the compass are North,
