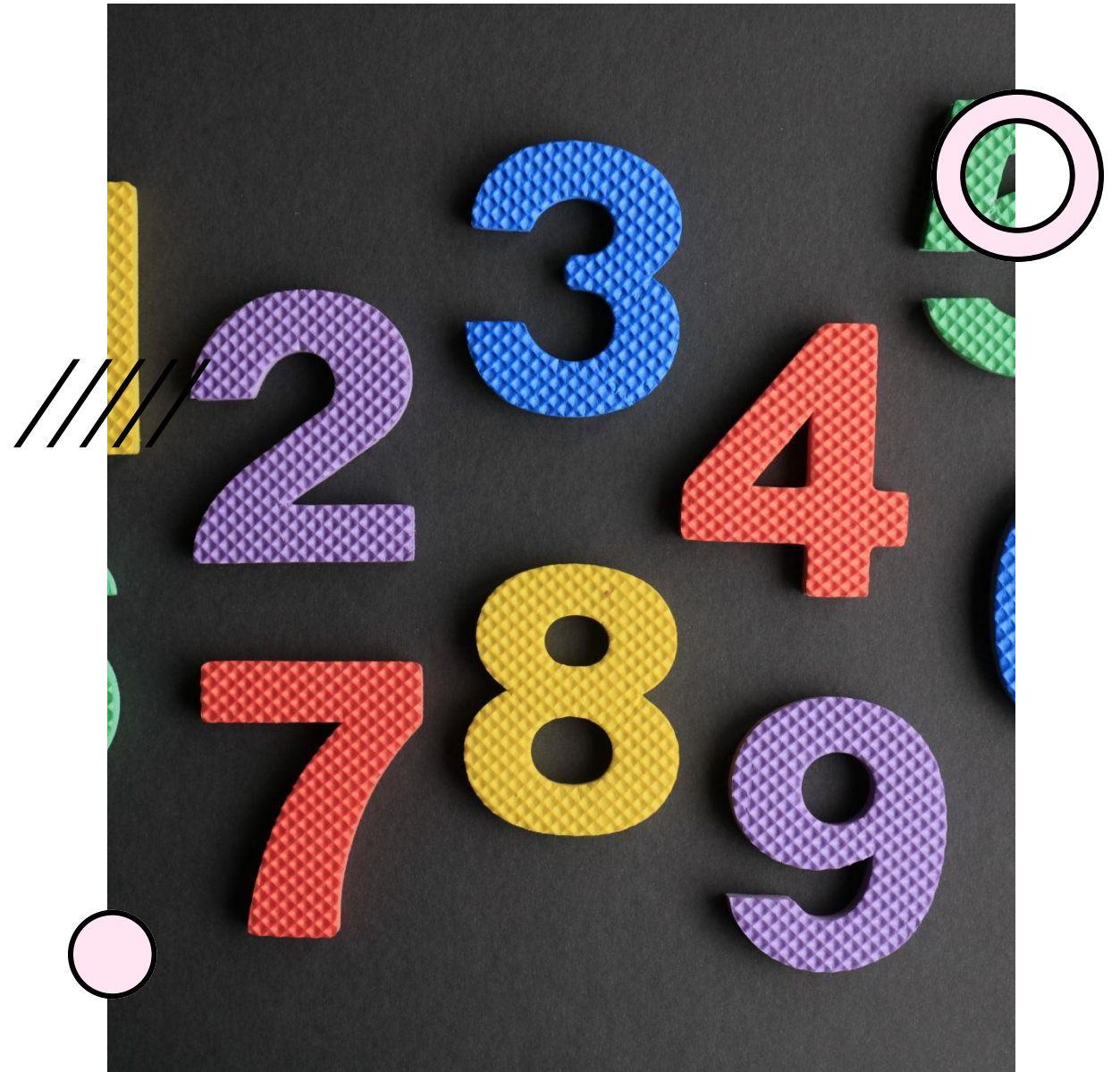


M A T H S

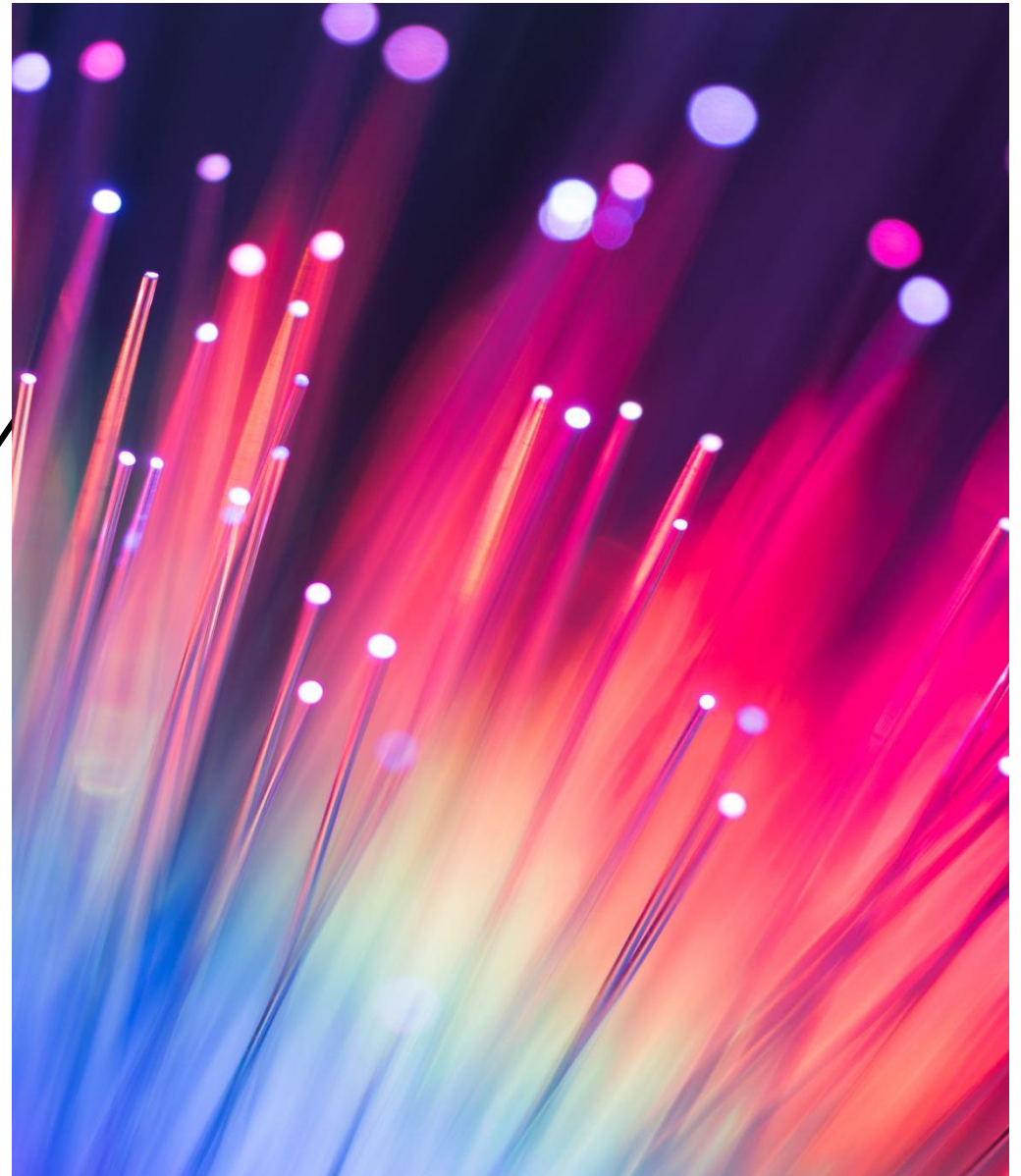
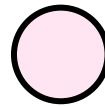
SCIENCE

We will explore the properties, formation, and changes of rocks, soils, and fossils, using hands-on investigations to understand natural processes like weathering, erosion, and the rock cycle while developing scientific observation, questioning, and presentation skills.



- Weathering is when rocks break into smaller pieces because of things like rain, wind, and temperature changes.
- Erosion is when those broken pieces of rock and soil are moved away by water, wind, or ice.
- Fossils are remains or marks of old plants and animals that are found in sedimentary rocks, showing us what life used to be like.

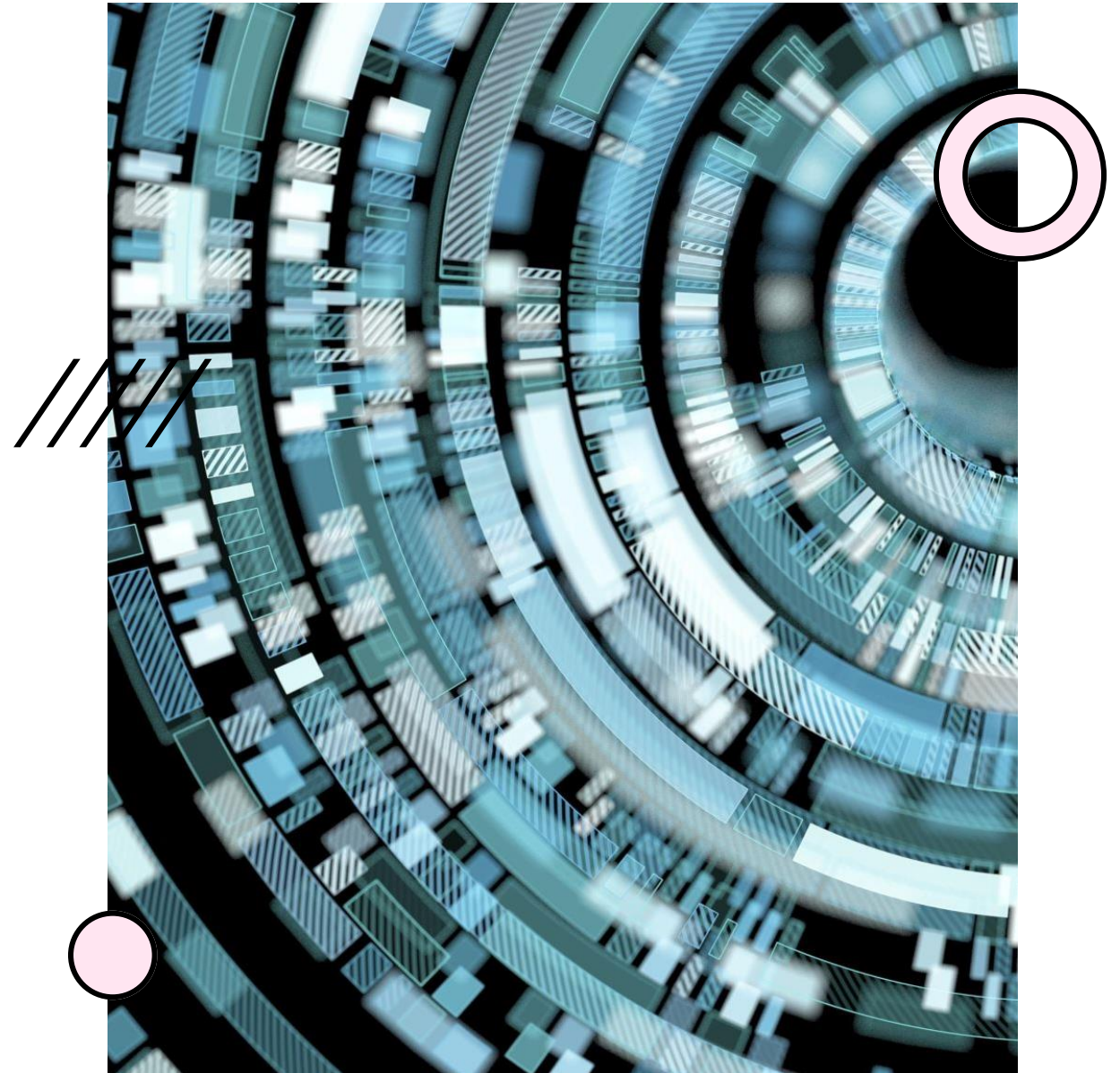


COMPUTING

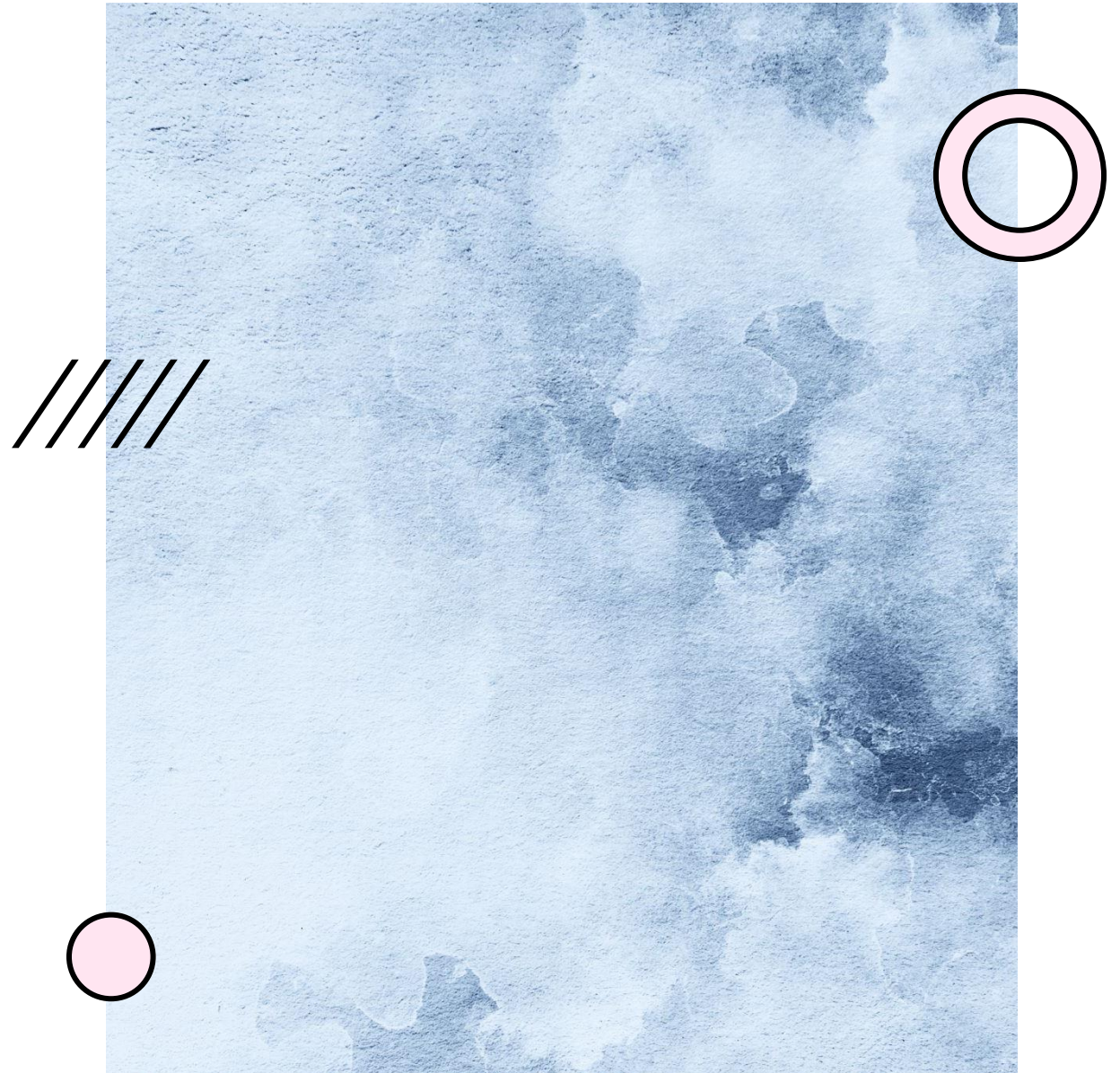
We will be creating pinch pots in the style of Greek pottery.

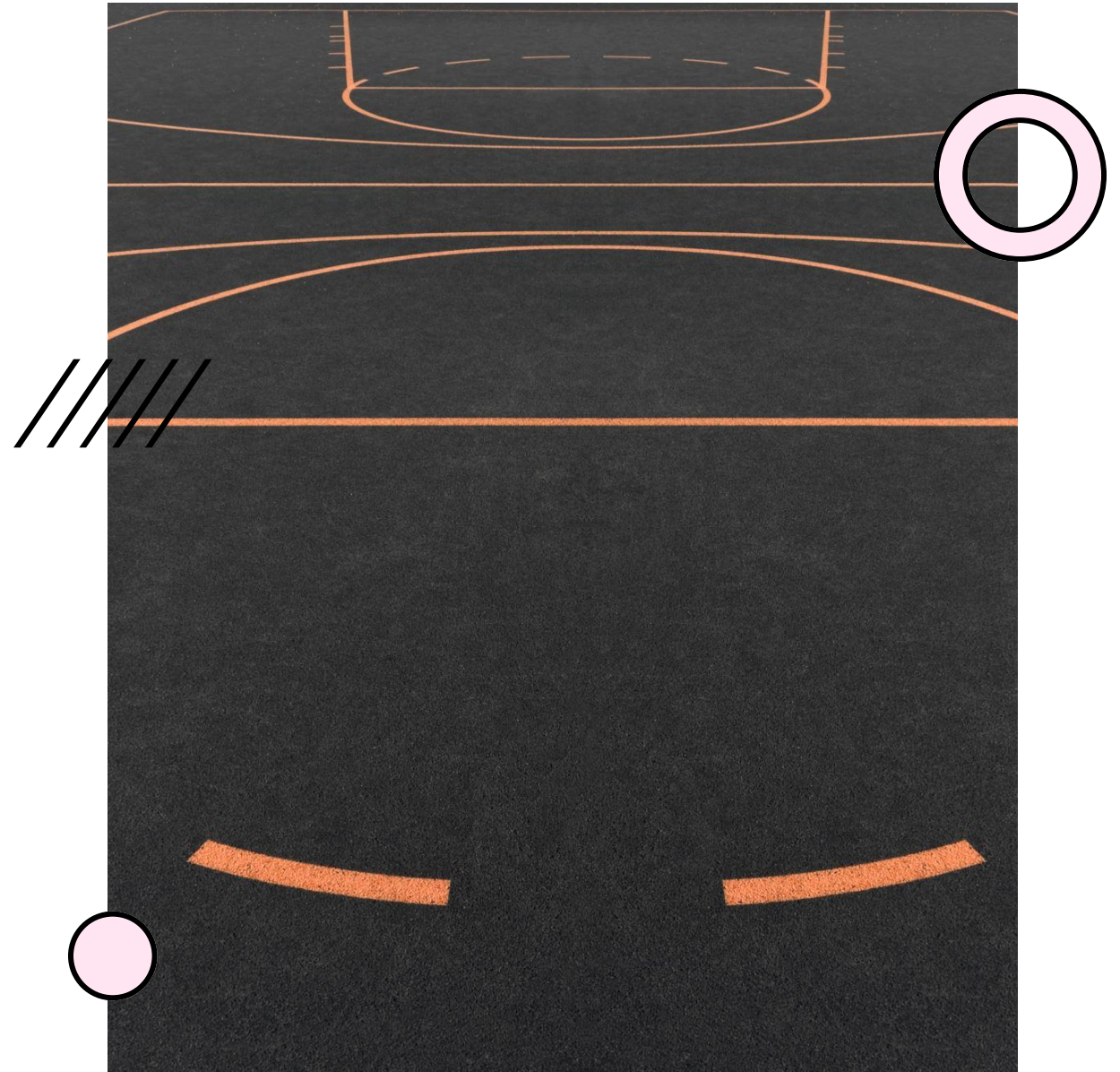

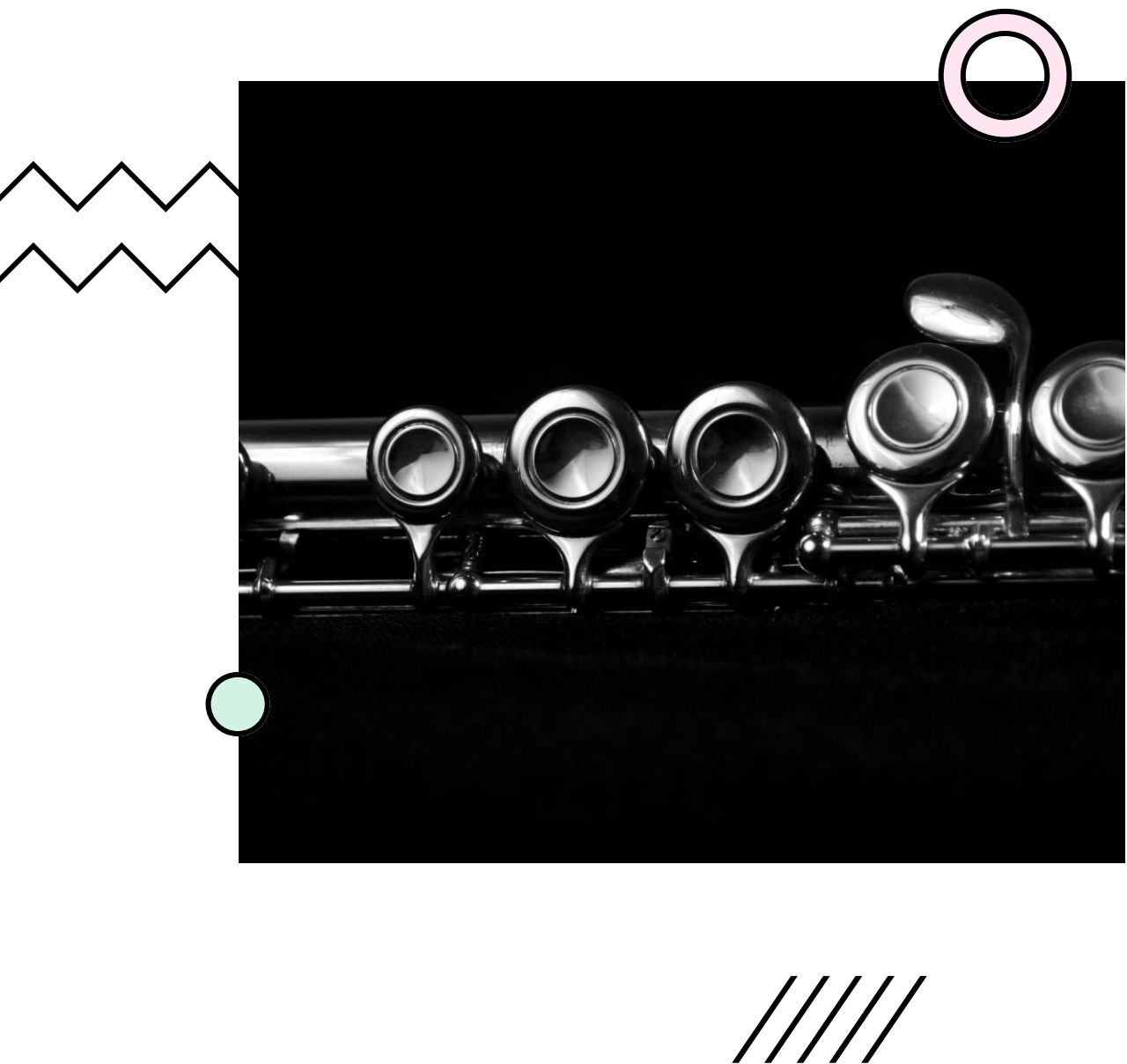
