WRITING

The text types we are learning about this half term is a Narrative based on the short film Feast from Walt Disney Animation Studios

 It is important to map the plot points and analyse the highs and lows of the narrative built across a unit, as this will generate the task for independent writing at the end. Using the 'Independent Writing Teaching Sequence' included, teachers move through the steps to guide children from the highly modelled Sentence Stack to writing independently. When writing narrative, the pupil's independent task should be to craft their own text which mirrors the highs and lows mapped. It is within the teacher's discretion to choose a big idea focus for pupils to build their own ideas e.g. story about a character who shows their bravery. This gives pupils real freedom to develop their plot points independently.

- 1. Henry VIII was King of England 1509- 1547.
- 2. Henry VIII married 6 times and had 3 children called Mary, Elizabeth and Edward.
- 3. The Battle of Bosworth took place in 1485 to begin the Tudor era.
- 4. Henry VIII broke from Rome in 1528 and created the Church of England.
- 5. Henry VIII's ship 'The Mary Rose' sank in Solent in 1545.

Understand the impact:


Make simple links between the description of Pentecost in Acts 2, the Holy Spirit, the kingdom of God, and how Christians live now Describe how Christians show their beliefs about the Holy Spirit in worship

Make connections:

Make links between ideas about the kingdom of God in the Bible and what people believe about following



- The gospels contain the parables that Jesus told and how he told people to live known as commandments.
- The gospels contain the two great commandments of Jesus that tell Christians how to live.
- He also gave The Sermon on the Mount to tell people how to live.
- Jesus would show that the good news was for everyone including those people in society many did not like. An example of this was Jesus' healing people with leprosy, a disease that people were sacred of.







We will be learning about shape.

In this unit, pupils will learn how to:

- Objective 1: I will learn and become familiar with 5 shapes nouns and their determiners in French.
- Objective 2: I will learn and become familiar with 5 more shapes nouns and their determiners in French.
- Objective 3: I will learn more about the 2 determiners for 'a' in French.
- Objective 4: I will revise numbers 1-5 in French and express how many of each shape I can see.
- Objective 5: I will learn how to use my new knowledge on shapes in a variety of creative tasks in French





We will be learning about Tennis and Basketball.

- To watch, track, and catch a tennis ball successfully.
- To hit a ball into space (at different speeds and heights) to try beat an opponent.
- To perform a basic forehand action with increasing accuracy.
- To keep a rally going using a range of shots.
- To perform a basic backhand shot with increasing control.
- To compete with others
- To pass / send a ball with increasing accuracy.
- To find and use space well to keep possession.
- To move with the ball keeping it under control.
- To apply basic attacking and defending principles.
- To pass the ball in different ways.
- To Play in small sided games, employing simple tactics







We will be creating a Tudor style portrait paintings.

I can mix colours accurately and select appropriate brushes for my artwork.








MUSIC

We will be learning about during the unit, pupils will learn to sing and play the song, develop technical skills on tuned percussion, and experience playing in a class band.

Playing and singing activity is supported by listening to range of music in a folk and folk-rock style, comparing different artists' styles.

- Lesson 1: Get to know the song Learn Verse 1, learn the verse chords.
- Lesson 2: Get to know the song Learn the Chorus, learn the Chorus chords.
- Lesson 3: Progression snapshot 2. Make a video recording of children singing.
- Lesson 4: Recap playing Verse 1 and the Chorus and compare pieces of music.
- Lesson 5: Practise singing and playing the song.
- Lesson 6: Rehearse and perform.
