Year 4 homework – Summer Term

Level 1 Homework (<u>must</u> be completed and handed in by the due date) Times Table Rockstars- 15 minutes per week (ideally 3 minutes a day, 5x a week). A garage task has been set on TTRS.

Spelling Shed- 15 minutes per week (ideally 3 minutes a day, 5x a week). Work on the spelling assignment you have been set (containing statutory spellings). When you reach 'Royal Bee', a Mastery Zone Button will appear. Children should then click and play on this it will automatically determine their spelling strengths and areas for improvement. Also, more games will appear for you to play!

Reading - 5x a week (ideally for 5-10 minutes each time). In year 4 this can be reading quietly rather than aloud and listened to, however a combination of both is welcomed.

Please ensure that all reads are entered into reading records as these will be counted on a Friday.

For Level 1 homework, the week runs from a Friday to Friday.

Level 2 Homework (we would love you to have a go at completing this and share the rest of half term.

When practising your spellings you may wish to use the spelling menu on our class ho seeing some of your word lists.

History based ideas

1. Create a Tudor Fact Poster Research 5 fascinating facts about the Tudors and present them on a colourful poster. Include pictures, drawings, and bold titles.

2. Design a Tudor Outfit

Draw and label a Tudor outfit for a king, queen, noble, or servant. Bonus points for using fabric scraps or textured paper!

3. Tudor Diary Entry

Write a diary entry from the point of view of a child living in Tudor times. What would a day in their life be like?

4. Build a Tudor House (Model or Drawing)

Use cardboard, LEGO, or draw a detailed sketch of a Tudor-style house. Include timber beams, a thatched or tiled roof, and explain the features.



Learn the following KIRFS (suggest 2 minutes a day 5x a week) be a KIRFS quiz set at the end of each half term.

- 1. Henry VIII was King of England 1509-1547.
- 2. Henry VIII married 6 times and had 3 children called Mary, Elizabeth and Edward.
- 3. The Battle of Bosworth took place in 1485 to begin the Tudor era.
- 4. Henry VIII broke from Rome in 1528 and created the Church of England.
- 5. Henry VIII's ship 'The Mary Rose' sank in Solent in 1545.
- The gospels contain the parables that Jesus told and how he told people to live known as commandments.
- The gospels contain the two great commandments of Jesus that tell Christians how to live.
- He also gave The Sermon on the Mount to tell people how to live.
- Jesus would show that the good news was for everyone including those people in society many did not like. An example of this was Jesus' healing people with leprosy, a disease that people were sacred of.

Level 3 Homework (we would love you to have a go at these ongoing projects, artwork or research tasks and bring them in when ready)

Piece 1 – Family Crest Design

Create a coat of arms for your own family, inspired by Tudor heraldry. Include symbols that represent your family's interests.

Piece 2 — Tudor Menu

Create a menu for a Tudor feast. What kind of food did rich and poor people eat? Add drawings or decorate it like a real menu. – try making some!
