Date of visit: 25 January 2023 Governor name: Wendy Vincent Focus of visit and name of lead staff member: Meeting with the maths subject lead, Michael Barritt, to discuss how maths is progressing following his recent learning walk and work scrutiny. Summary of discussion: MB had observed maths lessons in years 1 and 3 and looked at books in years 1, 2 and 3. There were many positives in lessons: high expectation of pupils appropriate pace well-planned resources used effectively • pupils engaged good use of maths vocabulary • adapting lesson plans to accommodate the needs of the pupils. Areas to develop: additional adults in the classroom should be well deployed throughout the lesson to support pupils' learning, • to ensure "pair and share" is effective TTYP (Turn To Your Partner) needs to be embedded in lessons Good practice observed in the work scrutiny: • pupils' work well presented range of reasoning and fluency guestions use of "because" in written answers showing understanding evidence of using marking policy follow up of marked work. Development points: showing which questions provided challenge, especially for more able pupils more consistent use of codes in marking policy to show where work has been guided or supported, or independent (where expected to be guided or supported) Safeguarding: Positive staff/pupil relationships in lessons. Effective behaviour management Next steps:

MB will be recognising successes and addressing development points both with individual teachers and with the whole staff in a forthcoming staff meeting.

I will be undertaking a maths walk and book scrutiny with MB on Wednesday 1 March and we will review the data from the recent Star Maths assessments. We will also discuss the progress being made towards the priorities in the school development plan.

Any issues for the governing body:

For various reasons (the main one being staff absences) only 2 classes were observed by MB on his learning walk and so he did not have the opportunity to evaluate the quality of teaching and learning in maths across the school.

Any other comments:
