



We will be learning about Electricity. We will solve how to make a lightbulb, buzzer and motor work. We will explore how to identify insulators and conductors of electricity





A circuit is a complete path that electricity flows around.







P.S.H.E








We will be learning verbs to name and describe various fruits and different kinds of ice-cream



- How do we ask for ice-creams in different flavours, like vanilla, strawberry, pistachio, mint and banana?


