Year 4 homework - Autumn Term

Level 1 Homework (must be completed and handed in by the due date)

Times Table Rockstars- 15 minutes per week (ideally 3 minutes a day, 5x a week). A garage task has been set on TTRS.

Spelling Shed- 15 minutes per week (ideally 3 minutes a day, 5x a week). Work on the spelling assignment you have been set (containing statutory spellings). When you reach 'Royal Bee', a Mastery Zone Button will appear. Children should then click and play on this it will automatically determine their spelling strengths and areas for improvement. Also,

Reading - 5x a week (ideally for 5-10 minutes each time). In year 4 this can be reading quietly rather than aloud and listened to, however a combination of both is welcomed.

Please ensure that all reads are entered into reading records as these will be counted on a Friday.

For Level 1 homework, the week runs from a Friday to Friday.

Level 2 Homework (we would love you to have a go at completing this and share the rest of half term.

When practising your spellings you may wish to use the spelling menu on our class ho seeing some of your word lists.

Geography based ideas

Cultural Artifact Creation: Students can choose a traditional Nigerian artifact (like a mask, drum, or textile) and create a model or drawing of it.

African Geography Quiz: Students can create a quiz about African countries, capitals, and landmarks.

Wildlife Research: Students to select an endangered species native to Africa, such as the African elephant or rhinoceros. They should research its habitat, behavior, and the reasons for its endangered status and present their findings in a report or presentation.

Traditional Story Writing: Students can write their own short story inspired by traditional African folktales. They should include a moral lesson and illustrate their story with drawings.

Cuisine Exploration Project: Atudents to research a popular dish from Nigeria, such as suya or egusi soup. They should write about the ingredients, how it's prepared, and its cultural importance.



Learn the following KIRFS (suggest 2 minutes a day 5x a week) There will be a KIRFS quiz set at the end of each half term.
